### We're Accountable For Our Sins, Even If We're Tricked

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#### ➤ Intro:

- 1 Cor. 10:11 Paul warns us not to make the same mistakes as Israel
- a few weeks ago we studied this passage as it relates to the example of Israel's idolatry with a golden calf while Moses was on a mountain receiving the Ten Commandments
- this lesson examines the next example (vs. 8) and we learn we're accountable for all our sins, even if we're tricked
- ➤ As a child of God, you're accountable to Him for sin being baptized is not a "sin free" card
  - 1 Cor. 10:1-5 God was displeased with most of His children, they died in the wilderness without entering the promised land all had the same chance, few were successful
- ➤ -1 Cor. 10:6 important to train ourselves not to crave evil things
  - 2 Tim. 3:16-17 train ourselves with the word of God (Rom. 1:16)
- ➤ -1 Cor. 10:7 example of Israel and the golden calf, when Moses was upon mountain to receive Ten Commandments, committed idolatry, sinful playing, craved evil things, not long after seeing all miracles God did when bring then out of Egypt
  - punished for sin, Moses destroyed the golden calf, crushed up gold on put in water, made them drink it
  - as God's children, we are still accountable for sin
    - be careful not to come short of God's grace (Heb. 4:1; 12:15)
    - work out our salvation with fear and trembling (Phil. 2:12)
    - not "once saved always saved" doctrine

- **Example: Israel's sin at Peor** accountable for sin even if tricked
  - 1 Cor. 10:8 Paul's reference to Israel's sin at Peor act immorally (NASV), fornication (ASV, KJ), spiritual and physical harlotry (Num. 25)
    - example: not to crave evil, not engage in idolatry and fornication, sin punished by God
  - background: Balak and Balaam
    - Balak, king of Moab, saw what Israel had done to other nations, as they made their way to the Promise Land, and he formed an alliance with the Midianites to rise up against Israel
    - Balak offered Balaam, a prophet of God, money to curse Israel, so they would not destroy them, as Israel had done to other nations
    - God wouldn't allow Balaam to curse Israel
    - but Balaam, wanting the king's money, devised a plan by which the Moabites inticed Israel to sin, God punished them for their sins and 24,000 were killed in one day
  - background: Israel's sin at Peor (Num. 25:1-18)
    - Moabites enticed the Israelite men to engage in fornication with women (haroltry)
    - then they got the Israelites to worship idols spiritual fornication
    - God became angry and punished the Israelites, whereby 24,000 were killed in one day
    - then God punished the Moabites and Balaam
- R. Num. 25:18a Israel was deceived with tricks, but still held accountable punished for sin, and had to repent
  - illus.: wiles of the devil, deception of false teachers, lust of sin
  - even if we're tricked into sin, we are equally as guilty of sin, must repent, punished
- ➤ Num. 25:1 the trick was enticement with sexual sin harlotry with daughters
  - illus.: false teachers use sexual lusts to deceive (trick) people (2 Pet. 2) condone sexual sin
  - illus.: false churches condone unlawful marriage, fornication, homosexuality, pedophelia to trick people
  - Satan, roaring lion seeking people to devour, uses other people to deceive us (1 Pet. 5:8)
    - illus.: Eve convinced Adam to sin, though he was not deceived by Satan himself
    - illus.: "the devil made me do it" isn't an excuse not excuse the sin
- ➤ Num. 25:2 the Moabites progressed from trickery with sexual sin to sinful worship (idolatry)
  - illus.: some false religions get people drunk (provide liquor), and validate their sinful sexual desires, to get them to join their religion
  - Satan, and people who deceive us, use physical sin to progressively lead people into false religions
    - illus. saying: give Satan an inch today, he'll take a mile tomorrow
    - illus. saying: a little sin leads to a lot of sin people can never get enough sin like drugs and alcohol
- ➤ Num. 25:3-5 Israel punished for their sin, even though they we're tricked (deceived)
  - God punishes us for our sin as His children, even if we're tricked and deceived
  - therefore, important:
    - elders, watch over flock
    - warning and admonishing each other
    - prayer, staying alert in it (Eph. 6:18) illus.: Jesus, apostles in garden, watch and pray with Him
    - Bible study, learning it for ourselves (1 Pet. 5:8; 2 Pet. 3:16)

# ➤ - Num. 25:6-9 Phinehas was jealous with God's jealousy, and God stopped the plague

- story: Zimri brought a Midianite woman home to his relatives, implication to commit fornication
  - brought her in the sight of the Israelites, while many were weeping at the doorway to the tent of meeting, because of the plague and possibly because of their sin
  - Phinehas got a spear, went into the tent, killed both Zimri and the woman
  - the plague stopped 24,00 had died
- Num. 25:10-12 we must have the jealousy of God, to be pleasing to Him have same feelings about sin as God
  - fight with the word today, not spears (Eph. 6:17)
  - with the jealousy of God, we keep sin out of our lives, and help others obey evangelism
  - with the jealousy of God, we keep sin out of our families children, training and admonition
  - with the jealousy of God, we keep sin out of the church, exercise church discipline
  - with the jealousy of God, we stand against sin in our communities

## ➤ - Num. 25:16-18 God commands Moses to be hostile toward the Midianites

- Num. 31:7-18 people who deceived Israel were severely punished
  - punishment of evil doers, false teachers
  - stay away from evil people
    - some Midianites were in the wrong place at the wrong time, killed (children)
    - today, some people are punished (hurt, killed) just because with the wrong people
  - stay around the right people
    - 2 Tim. 2:22 flee youthful lusts, pursue righteousness and faith and love and peace, with those who call on the Lord from a pure heart
- Rev. 2:14-17 people who are in churches that are like Balaam, deceiving and tricking folks with false doctrines, will be severely punished
  - make sure:
    - not been tricked and deceived with false doctrine
    - in the Lord's church, the right church, or punished for eternity
    - i.e., make sure obeying God's word study it yourself know it obey it

## Summary / Inv.

- we're accountable for our sins, even if we're tricked and deceived Adam & Eve
  - make sure we know the truth, and we're obeying it
  - make sure no one deceives us or tricks us, with false doctrine, or by enticing us with sin
- inv.: Jesus shed His blood so we wouldn't have to undergo eternal punishment, obey, baptized for remission of sins, washed way in His blood
