➤ Intro:

- beginning of the saying that later became a song He ain't heavy; he's my brother
 - Roe Fulkerson/Kiwanis Magazine: In 1924, the first editor of Kiwanis Magazine, Roe Fulkerson, published a column carrying the title "He Ain't Heavy, He's My Brother". Dated September 1924, the article speaks of Fulkerson's inspiring encounter with "a spindly and physically weak lad" carrying a baby and "staggering towards a neighboring park". " 'Pretty big load for such a small kid' I said as I met him. 'Why, mister,' he smiled, 'He ain't heavy; he's my brother.' " (Wikipedia)
- explanation of the pic: two brothers in a mostly abandoned Darfur village, with no way to escape (NY Times. 2004)
- title: He's Not Heaven, He's My Brother
- ➤ All of us need help bearing burdens!
 - Mk. 8:34-38 all have a cross to bear, need help What cross are you bearing?
 - illus.: Simon Cyrene helped Jesus bear His cross imagine
- ➤ -1 Pet. 2:21a, 24a Jesus bore our burdens on the cross Jesus bore our cross
 - Is. 53:4a He bore our griefs, and our sorrows He carried
 - song #603, Burdens Are Lifted At Calvary
- ➤ -1 Pet. 5:6-7 God wants us to cast our cares on Him wants to help carry our cross
 - illus.: 2 Cor. 5:4 burdened by mortal life, wanting to be clothed with immortality
 - illus.: as Jesus cast His care on God in the garden, angel ministered to Him
- ➤ God wants us to help each other bear one another's burdens
 - 1 Th. 5:14 encourage the fainthearted, help the weak, be patient with everyone
 - Heb. 4:16; 10:23-25 a benefit of being a Christian, and assembling with the saints
- ➤ Gal. 6:2 bear one another's burdens, and fulfill the law of Christ
 - Ja. 1:27 pure and undefiled religion, visit orphans and widows in their distress
 - Ja 5:16-17 pray for one another, healed, effective prayer of a righteous man can accomplish much
 - Ja. 5:19-20 any among you strays, one turns him back, save his soul from death
- > next: three reasons our brethren's burdens aren't heavy

- ➤ He's not heavy, because God's doing the work through me! we're instruments of God's power
 - Phil. 1:6; 2:13 God works through us, according to His will and pleasure God does it
- ➤ -1 Th. 2:13b word works in us, because we believe believe, empowered by word
- ➤ Eph. 3:16, 20, 21 strengthened with power, inner man abundant power
 - ???: If God's doing the work, why doesn't He just make us strong enough to bear our own burdens, so we don;t have to depend on others? it's the way He wants it, helping each other as brethren, helps us reply on others and reply on God
- ➤ He's not heavy, **because I love my brethren!** attitude
 - agape
 - Jn. 13:34-35 love one another, as Jesus loves us, know we're Jesus' disciples
 - Do you love your brethren like Jesus loves you? bear burdens?
 - brotherly love
- ► 1 Pet. 1:22 fervently love brethren from heart
- Rom. 12:10 devoted to one another, preference to one another in honor
- ➤ illus.: pic: U.S.S. Pueblo
 - U.S.S. Pueblo was **captured by the North Koreans, eighty-two surviving crew members** were thrown into a **brutal captivity**
 - one instance, thirteen of the men required to sit in a rigid manner around a table, assigned places
 - after several hours the **door violently flung open and a North Korean guard brutally beat the man** in **the first chair** with the butt of his rifle happened for **3 days to same man**
 - after 3rd day, a different sailor took his place
 - the door was flung open, guard beat the new man
 - for weeks, each day a new man stepped forward to sit in that chair
 - at last the guards gave up in exasperation
 - bearing one another's burdens, they all survived victory fervent / devoted / brotherly love
 - "everyone" suffered, so "all" could live
- > if you care about people enough, you'll bear their burdens
 - Lk. 10:25-37 good Samaritan cf. priest and Levite mercy and compassion
 - Luke 15:11-32 prodigal son cf. young brother forgiveness
- ➤ He's not heavy, because I'm doing these things to Jesus! purpose
 - Matt. 25:31-40 to bear a brother's burden, is to bear Jesus' burden do it to brother, do it to Jesus
 - When you bear a brother's burden, do you see yourself bearing it for Jesus?
 - illus.: visiting the sick, doing it to Jesus
 - illus.: visiting the shut-in, taking food and doing chores, doing it to Jesus
 - illus.: calling on phone and encouraging, doing it to Jesus
 - If Jesus was physically there when we visited and called, what would you do differently?
