


Basic Vocabulary Series I: Puzzle 9

1. The city where only Rahab "and her father's household, and all that she had," were preserved from destruction, according to the promise of the spies (Josh. 2:14).
5. An Arabian patriarch who resided in the land of Uz (q.v.). While living in the midst of great prosperity, he was suddenly overwhelmed by a series of sore trials that fell upon him.
6. One of the "greater prophets" of the Old Testament, son of Hilkiyah (q.v.), a priest of Anathoth (Jer. 1:1; 32:6).
7. The Lord's name.
8. The second son of Joseph, born in Egypt (Gen. 41:52; 46:20).

2. One who purchases back something that had been lost, by the payment of a ransom.
3. The eighth of the twelve minor prophets.
4. The instrument of crucifixion.
5. A boy sold into slavery who saved his people from famine.
6. The city first mentioned in Scripture under the name Salem (Gen. 14:18; comp. Ps. 76:2).
7. The name derived from the patriarch Judah.
10. A contract or agreement between two parties.

9. Hairy, Rebekah's first-born twin son (Gen. 25:25).
10. "Anointed."
12. The second son of Adam and Eve. He was put to death by his brother Cain (Gen. 4:1-16).
13. The queen of Ahasuerus, and heroine of the book that bears her name.
16. An apostle, the brother of James, the son of Zebedee (Matt. 4:21).
17. Adam's wife.
18. Last of the historical books of the New Testament.
19. The garden in which the first parents dwelt.
20. The man God created.
21. Saturday, the day on which the Jews were commanded to rest.
11. The daughter of Bethuel and the wife of Isaac (Gen. 22:23; 24:67).
14. A young evangelist to whom Paul wrote one epistle and who was with Paul and Barnabas at Antioch.
15. This Syriac or Chaldee word is found three times in the New Testament (Mark 14:36; Rom. 8:15; Gal. 4:6), and in each case is followed by its Greek equivalent, which is translated "father."
16. The second of the twelve minor prophets. He was the son of Pethuel.
17. Help. A priest among those that returned to Jerusalem under Zerubabel (Neh. 12:1).
